## "Light for Life"

**Project managed by the non profit making organisation NPA/NGO Association Groups "Insieme si può"**

The "Light for Life" project aims to ensure **access to quality healthcare services in vulnerable contexts**, addressing the health crisis in **Syria, Uganda, and Chad**. In these areas, extreme poverty, conflict, and inefficient infrastructure undermine the right to health for millions of people.

### **Proposed Interventions:**

**Chad:** In a country with the lowest Human Development Index, the project focuses on a medical center in N'djamena, with particular attention to pediatrics. The installation of solar panels and generators will ensure renewable energy and continuity of medical services, supporting vulnerable families.

**Uganda:** The 'Mary Queen of Peace' medical center serves over 2,000 people but faces challenges due to a lack of electricity. The implementation of solar panels will enable the use of ultrasound equipment, and training for staff will be planned to improve care for mothers and children.

**Syria:** In collaboration with Support and Sustain for Children (SSCh), the project aims to maintain a mobile medical unit in the refugee camps of the Azaz province, providing healthcare assistance to those unable to access medical facilities. The unit, already operational, has reached over 2,220 patients and will ensure an additional year of operation in 2025, including hiring a midwife to improve maternal health.

"Light for Life" represents a concrete commitment to improving health conditions in the most vulnerable regions and saving lives.

## **Project 'Give Light to the Future' managed by the Dr. Ambrosoli Memorial Hospital Foundation ETS**

The 'Give Light to the Future' project tackles the **serious problem of maternal and infant mortality in Uganda**, where too many mothers and babies lose their lives due to the difficulty of accessing antenatal care and childbirth assistance. Promoted by the Ambrosoli Foundation, the project aims to **ensure safe delivery for 3,000 mothers and their babies at the hospital in Kalongo**, Uganda.

In a context where only 70% of women manage to reach health facilities, often after facing enormous difficulties due to poverty and distance, the maternity ward of the Kalongo hospital, with its 75 beds and 19 dedicated staff, becomes a beacon of hope.

**The beating heart of this initiative is the midwife**, essential in a country where there is only one midwife for every 2,000 inhabitants. Midwives in Kalongo not only assist expectant mothers during childbirth, but also accompany every mother on a life-long journey, offering hope and a future to thousands of families.

Through the project 'Give Light to the Future' it will be possible to support the maternity ward of the Kalongo hospital, guaranteeing the constant and dedicated presence of 15 midwives and a head nurse for an entire year, thus ensuring continuous and high quality maternal care, as well as a better future for thousands of families.

## **The road belongs to everyone, starting with the most fragile**

The School Project of the Michele Scarponi Foundation ETS

The School Project is an itinerary that **aims to make students aware of the importance of respecting the rules, life on the road and sustainable mobility through a transversal educational approach that integrates environmental, social and economic aspects**. Starting from Michele's story, his sporting and human story, the focus is on sport, family and Michele's values as a person/group. By recounting his death, we reflect on the theme of road violence and the pain it causes, highlighting not only the causes but also possible solutions, and we arrive at the transformation of pain into a gift with the message of the foot on the ground that the Foundation carries out. The **classroom meetings** are moments of in-depth analysis aimed at thinking together about the reality of our cities and imagining them from a different perspective. Through the development of various focuses (analysis of the territorial context, the relationship between speed and safety, the mass media and communication, the road as a common space, the environment and health) a **profound and value-based debate is initiated with the students on road safety and sustainable mobility**.

To date more than 50 schools have been visited and met 30,000 students met.
